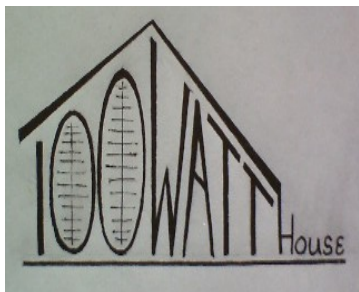

Can everyone on Earth enjoy the benefits of electricity without destroying the planet? Yes! But we must step out of our Energy Glutton Boxes to see the solution.

The typical Vermont home uses 600 kwhr per month in electricity. The 100 Watt House uses just 15 kwhr (**40 times less!**)---yet keeps two writers happily typing on their computers, listening to the radio & TV, and generally connected to the modern world. Somewhere between these extremes lies the answer. For example, without any lifestyle changes, you could use at least 50% less energy than you do today by following some 100 Watt techniques in your own life.

Michael J. Daley is an author, energy educator, and citizen activist. He built his own home, including the solar electric system, strung his own telephone lines, and converted two cars to electric drive.
